




## When Do I Arrive?

Registration begins at **2:00 p.m.** on the **first day of camp.** Dinner will be served at 5:00 p.m. Camp activities will begin immediately following our General Assembly session at 4:00. No Campers will be permitted on the premises before 2:00 p.m.



## Dress Code & Conduct



Youth camp policy **requires** a high standard of conduct and moderate dress. All language, behavior and clothing must remain modest at all times. Like many schools, we use the **“dollar bill knee test”** when the appropriate length of attire is in question. Halter-tops, backless clothing, spaghetti straps, see-through shirts and similar attire **are not permitted.** We discourage bringing new or expensive clothes to camp. **Girls in Teen Camp** are encouraged to wear dresses, skirts (appropriate lengths) or dress slacks to worship services, and **guys** should wear dress slacks and nice shirts. **Campers age 7-12** wear play clothes to all activities including church. All dress is subject to staff discretion. If a camper violates the dress code, opportunity will be given to correct the situation. A camper who continues to violate the dress code will be subject to disciplinary action which could include being sent home without fees being refunded.

## Room Assignments

Every effort has been made to room campers with the person(s) they requested on their application. Assignments are made according to the date when applications are post-marked with a first-registered, first-assigned basis. **After everyone has arrived and is present, room changes will be considered.** Remember, camp is a great experience regardless of the room assignment.



## Campers on Medication

All medication will be administered properly by the Camp Nurse. **Send only the exact amount** of medicine needed for days at camp. The medication **will be received by the Camp Nurse at check-in.** Medication must be in the **proper container** and placed in a **zip-lock bag** along with a completed **“Campers Medical Form”** (see next panel of brochure for form). Campers should enclose a current picture for identification purposes, this will be of great assistance to the Camp Nurse.

## Refund/Transfer Policy


The camp fee, less your deposit, **is refundable if notified five (5) working days in advance.**

## Spending Money

Campers **should bring spending money** for the Snack Bar and Camp Store. There will be **camp souvenirs** and **camp t-shirts** available for purchase. The recommended daily average is between \$5.00–\$10.00 per day.


## Visitors At Camp

Camp is a very unique experience. Visitors often distract younger campers and/or cause homesickness. ALL visitors will be dismissed immediately following the evening service.



**Meals** are not planned for visitors. We ask that visits be restricted to church services with prior approval from the Camp Director.
